Israelis Turn Attention to January 22nd Election

With the ceasefire between Israel and Hamas still holding campaigning for the January 22nd election has resumed. The bi-partisan spirit that Israelis displayed during Operation Pillar of Defense has already given way to the vitriolic attacks that inevitably accompany political debate in Israel. Opposition Leader Shaul Mofaz wasted no time in criticizing the government for agreeing to a ceasefire long before the operation's goals had been met.

With a month left until voters cast their ballots, every public opinion poll indicates that Benjamin Netanyahu will retain power, although Likud's shift further right during its primaries might alienate more moderate voters. Still, the opposition is splintered, even more so now that Tzipi Livni has re-entered the political arena. Likud-Yisrael Beytenu should have little difficulty forming another coalition. And while we have been uneasy with some of the government's policies - we did, after all, express our hope that Kadima would win the 2009 election - we have always believed that Jews living in their comfortable Diaspora pews should permit Israelis to make the decisions upon which their lives depend. There is a simple solution for those in the Diaspora who complain about the foreign or domestic policies of an Israeli government. Sink your roots in Israeli soil and become a full partner in the political life of your new home.

But while we will accept the outcome, whatever it is, there is no moral imperative preventing us from expressing our wish list for the make-up of the next knesset. And we would hope that the Israeli electorate would take a look at Yair Lapid and his new party Yesh Atid. Yesh Atid may not have the experience necessary to govern. Its foreign policy initiatives lack clarity and consistency. But its domestic platform takes dead aim at those Israelis who believe that there are "Christian Jews" living among them and that "secular Jews are just like goyim". A party that believes that all streams of Judaism must be treated equally deserves representation in the knesset.

Readers may remember Yair Lapid's late father, Yosef 'Tommy' Lapid, former justice minister and leader of the secular, almost virulently anti clerical Shinui party. But unlike his father Yair Lapid has sought out modern Orthodox rabbis who share his views on religious extremism. He counts among his friends rabbis Shai Piron, Benny Lau and Dov Lipman. Indeed, Piron is second on Yesh Atid's list. And in contrast to the home in which he grew up, when guests visit Lapid's Tel Aviv residence they will find kosher food on the table.

Yair Lapid may be more conciliatory than his father. He may want to avoid fratricidal conflicts. But Lapid intends to confront those who oppose his view that "religion should not be involved in politics". His party condemns heredi leaders who "don't let followers go to work and release themselves from poverty." It would fight any attempt to reintroduce the expired Tal Law that for too long "released people from their duties as citizens". Indeed, praying for the success of the IDF should be encouraged. Using it as an excuse to avoid active participation in the defence of Israel's citizens cannot be tolerated. The party would end the monopoly of the chief Rabbinate on marriage, scrap MK David Rotem's conversion bill and welcome women at the wall. Lapid reserves his harshest criticism for politicians such as United Torah Judaism's Yisrael Eichler who maintain that Reform Jews are "anti-Semites". For Lapir craven capitulation to religious extremists and the unilateral imposition of halachic law have no place in Israeli society. And to help ensure that smaller parties aren't able to cow the larger parties into submission and thereby paralyze policymaking, Yesh Atid would raise the threshold for knesset representation to 6%. While this is hardly the political overhaul Israel's electoral system needs, this measure would at least make it difficult for otherwise inconsequential political parties to exert an influence that their numerical strength does not justify.

Reform, Conservative and secular Israelis need a strong voice in the next knesset to continue their fight against the powers of inequity. They need to be certain that they have a place in the national religious constellation of the country. Polls vary but Yesh Atid is predicted to win up to ten MKs. That result, together with a rejuvenated Labor, would give a strong voice to those Israelis who resent being accused of avoiding the obligations necessary to be a good Jew.

Sister of Nazi Leader Hid Jews

Madeline Cornet, the sister of Leon Degrelle, leader of the Belgian Nazi Rexen movement instrumental in the deportation of Jews during the German occupation of Belgium, hid three Jews in her home near Brussels.

Hanna Nadel, 86, says that she, her niece and her mother was rescued by Cornet. The three had escaped deportation orders and were wandering aimlessly around the town of Sint-Genesius Rode. Cornet had a help wanted sign on her door. Cornet immediately hired them as cook and chambermaids.

Cornet apparently realized that the three women were Jewish but despite her family ties assured Nadel that they would survive. "I have", she told them, "broken with the fascism of my brother". When Nazi visitors came to the house the three Jews would hide in the basement. The gefilte fish Nadel's mother cooked, was given to her Nazi guests as "oriental fish".

Hanna Nadel, who was 16 at the time, eventually immigrated to Israel, Degrelle, who never apologized for his Nazi beliefs, managed to escape death after the war and died of natural causes in Spain in 1994.

Jewish Vote Propelled Obama

Barack Obama may not have received the 74% of the Jewish vote he garnered four years ago. But with 70% of Jews still supporting the Democrat, it appears that the massive fund raising efforts on the part of Jewish Republicans, and the perceived unfriendly attitude of the White House towards Israel, failed to make much of a dent in Jewish support for the president.

"We were outspent by Jewish Republicans by over \$40 million and they have only four points and another four years in exile to show for it," said Steve Rabinowitz, a former Clinton White House press

aid who ran a Jewish media hub to help the president's re-election bid. "Some mazel" he noted sarcastically.

While it may be true that Jews in general are shifting slightly to the right the decline in Jewish vote corresponded with the national decline for Obama.

Jewish Pollster Bang On

Polling during election is a highly competitive business. The public may become tired of the daily polls released, with all their minute details, but the reputation of the polling companies is at stake and they take their numbers, and their methodology very seriously.

The winner in the presidential polling sweep-stakes was Nate Silver, the man behind the popular FiveThirtyEight blog. Silver correctly predicted the results in 49 or the 50 states.

During the campaign Silver took a lot of heat from Conservative anchors for maintaining that Obama had a 90.9 per cent chance of being reelected. But even Bret Baier of FoxNews praised his accuracy at the end. And firms like Gallop and Rasmussen again were way off the mark.

Some 90 polling firms conducted at least one poll during the final weeks of the campaign. There seems little doubt that Silver deserves what one comedian called him on Twitter: "The Emperor of Math".

OBAMA AND THE JEWISH ELECTORATE

Prior to the election partisans on both sides sparred over the question of whether President Obama was a friend or a threat to Israel. We now know how Jewish voters felt and the result was close to my prediction that Obama would win 70% of the vote. He fell short of that total with 69%. The result left partisans spinning the numbers to suit their arguments, but

the result did provide some unambiguous conclusions.

First, let's look at the raw figures. Obama's share of the Jewish vote was nine points below what it was in 2008. It is two points below the average for a Democratic candidate and the lowest percentage since Michael Dukakis in 1988. This was also the second lowest Jewish vote total for

BOTH SIDES CLAIM WIN

ISRAELIS AND PALESTINIANS SEE OUTCOME DIFFERENTLY

At the aptly named Holy Bagel on Jaffa Road in downtown Jerusalem the morning after a halt to the fighting in the Gaza Strip was announced, patrons were skeptical that the nascent ceasefire would end the fighting for a long time.

"It won't last – I don't believe in it at all," Gavriel Yacobovich, 22, told The Media Line. "I'm not sure we should have undertaken a ground invasion but we should have kept fighting until we were sure that our citizens in the south can sleep quietly without rocket fire."

Yacobovich, wearing a green knitted skullcap

showing he is a religiously observant Jew, had just returned to Jerusalem from the border with Gaza, where he had been called up as a reservist. He said many soldiers were frustrated that Israel did not continue the fighting for longer.

"Of course, it is up to the political side to decide, but there was a sense that we didn't do enough in Gaza," he said. "We should have finished the job."

His girlfriend, Shira Badici, 22, a university student disagreed. She said the most important thing is that residents can now sleep peacefully in their homes without worrying about rocket fire.

"I think it's good because the people in the south were living in fear," she said. But looking at the other side of the coin, Shira added that, "At the same time, Hamas can just use this time to regroup and get stronger."

A poll reported on Channel Two television right after the cease-fire found that 70 percent of the residents of southern Israel opposed the cease-fire. Almost two-thirds of them thought it would not last long, and a quarter of those surveyed thought it would (Please turn to page 11)

FINDING A LIFELINE

BOYS TOWN JERUSALEM RECEIVES
RARE APPOINTMENT

In a rare appointment, Israel's Ministry of Education has selected Boys Town Jerusalem to open its third "mainstreaming" class in the 2012/13 school year to serve specialneeds students. The new 7th grade class will join the 10th and 12th grade classes now operating in the school. "Very few schools are called upon to conduct three classes," mainstreaming said Boys Town special education instructor Rabbi Mordechai Rosenfeld. "This is a tribute to Boys Town's hard-won accomplishments in granting special-needs students both life skills and independence."

Most of the mainstreaming students have high potential, but are plagued by harmful behavioral problems deriving from such family traumas as divorce or dysfunction. According to Rabbi Rosenfeld, the students arrive in 7th grade lacking motivation, self-esteem or study habits, which gravely impair their ability to learn. "Our program targets both the emotional and academic realms, building the student's self-confidence and his knowledge base at once."

Rabbi Rosenfeld's colleague Moshe Fortgang has been a special education instructor on the Boys Town mainstreaming team for nearly a decade. "I specialize in teaching the students strategies to apply to

AP'S DOUBLE STANDARD

ASSOCIATED PRESS HAS DIFFERENT STANDARDS FOR ISRAEL

How should reporters describe a targeted attack against a terrorist? A sterile "drone strike"? A neutral "killing"? Or an "assassination," with that word's negative connotations?

At the Associated Press, the answer apparently depends on who is responsible for the strike.

The Israeli military killed Hamas's senior militant commander in the Gaza Strip, Ahmed al-Jabari, after days of cross border attacks from Gaza that included over 100 rockets launched toward Israeli towns and an attack on an Israeli jeep patrolling its side of the border.

Associated coverage of the incident referred to Israel's pinpoint air strike as an "assassination," described it as a resumption of "Israel's poliof assassinating Palestinian militant leaders," pointed out that "Israeli aircraft have previously assassinated the previous commander of Hamas' military wing," and noted that "Israeli officials had said that they were considering assassinating top Hamas officials following a wave of rocket fire."

One might think AP's style book calls for describing such attacks assassinations. But the wire service has a whole different standard when it comes to U.S. drone strikes that so frequently target terrorists in Yemen and Afghanistan.

According to the Nexus news database, there have been 2,907 AP news stories mentioning one of the two countries along with the word "drone" or "drones." Of those stories, 208 also mention "assassi-

a winning Democratic candidate, besting only the 55% of Woodrow Wilson in 1916. Romnev's 30% share of the Jewish vote was the highest since 1988 when George H.W. Bush steamrollered Dukakis. The GOP total was six points above their historical average.

Anyway you look at it, Obama's support in the Jewish community was, by historical standards, unimpressive. And it could have easily been worse. Had the Republicans nominated a candidate who was strong on Israel and moderate on social issues (maybe Romney the governor, but not Romney the candidate), it is likely Obama's total would have been even lower and the Republican's high-

There is no great mystery about the reason for Obama's poor showing. While some Jews may have voted based on their concerns with the economy or other domestic issues, there is little doubt that the main reason for the vote was distrust of Obama's Middle East policy based primarily on his behavior during his first two years in office and fear that this would be the direction he would return to after the election.

Just over a year before the election, in September 2011, Obama's support among Jews fell precipitously to 54%, and 53% specifically said they disapproved of his handling of U.S.-Israel relations. But Obama's policy had already begun to change. For his last two years, he did not publicly criticize Israel, he expressed more anger at the Palestinians and stopped their UN efforts to gain statehood and declare settlements illegal. He also increased military cooperation with Israel and took every opportunity to assert his commitment to Israel.

This combined with the natural Jewish Democratic DNA had an impact and his poll numbers slowly climbed so that Gallup nearly hit the final vote on the head when it reported in September 2012 that 68% of Jews would vote for Obama and 29% Romney.

Obama's improvement in the polls also coincided with the Republican primary campaign forced Romney so far to the right that his moderate positions as governor were forgotten and he lost the opportunity for Jewish votes. Still, Jewish Republicans are touting the fact that nearly one-third of

American Jews repudiated Obama's policies, particularly on Israel, and that this is another sign that the GOP is attracting more Jews to the party. Sadly, this is not the case. If they could not get a better turnout against a candidate with so much baggage on Israel, it is hard to imagine a Republican doing better against a Democrat whose attitude toward Israel is unambiguously supportive.

It's also worth noting that Israelis still are extremely distrustful of Obama and overwhelmingly preferred Romney. Overcoming this trust gap will be crucial if Obama hopes to succeed in working with Israel on not only the Iranian issue but the peace process.

Ultimately, the election wasn't close and the Jewish vote didn't play a significant role in the outcome (though many individual Jews were important Obama donors, fundraisers and advisers). house they lived in to a small apartment out of the line of Israeli artillery fire while hostilities raged.

"It was so good to get back to my own bed after more than a week," he says.

Abu Salem argues that Hamas is coming out of this conflict stronger than ever, having stood up to the Israeli army - one of the strongest in the world - and proving it can hit Israel's major population center, the greater Tel Aviv area, and even reach to the outskirts of Jerusalem with its arsenal of rockets. For more than a week, he points out. life came to a complete standstill in southern Israel as more than a million Israelis huddled in bomb shelters. And a Grad rocket hit a building in Rishon Letzion near Tel Aviv, completely destroying the building, although there were no casualties.

At the same time, Israeli officials insist they have achieved a new level of deterrence with Hamas, which saw that Israel is unwilling to accept continued rocket fire on southern Israel. Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said Hamas is now responsible for ensuring that the smaller terrorist groups, like Islamic Jihad, also stop firing at the Jewish state.

Yet, Israeli analysts say it is too early to know whether these goals have really been achieved.

"We need to see if it is sustainable or not - it's too soon to see whether Hamas is capable restraining all of the other actors," Uzi Eilam, a security expert at the INSS think tank in Tel Aviv told The Media Line. "Time will show whether deterrence been achieved or Deterrence is fuzzy but in a few weeks time we will be more knowledgeable about how much deterrence has been strengthened."



all of their studies. Because they are generally quite impulsive, I teach them to carry out instructions, how to ask and answer questions, analyze and pass exams, and improve reading comprehension. It's a very long process, but through the years I have seen students gradually integrate the concepts to become more independent capable.'

Both instructors stress that Boys Town's very small mainstreaming classes (from eight to 14 students) and their inter-

disciplinary professional team of teachers, therapists, a psychologist and guidance counselor major elements in the success of the program. Moreover, the students are highly involved in Boys Town's school life and have good friends among the entire student body. nation" or some derivative of that word. But only one of the 208 stories referred to an American drone operation as an attempted "assassination." (A May 2003 article stated, "The U.S. government last year declared Hekmatyar a terrorist, and in May 2002 a CIA drone tried to assassinate him near Kabul, but missed and killed some of his followers.") In the 9 years that followed, during which U.S. targeted killings increased dramatically, not a single AP article described American drone attacks as assassinations in the voice of the reporter.

Most of the 208 articles used the word "assassination" in describing attacks by al Qaida or other killings by anti-American insurgents. And another few make mention of Israel's "assassination" of Hezbollah terror leader Imad Mughniyeh and Hamas leader Ahmed Yassin.

But notwithstanding the one exception, the Associated Press is extremely cautious measured when dealing with American strikes, using the loaded term "assassination" only when paraphrasing or quoting critics of the U.S. practice. A November 2010 story, for example, asserted that the drone strikes to kill high-ranking militants is rarely officially acknowledged by Washington. The program, which U.S. officials say has killed hundreds of insurgents, has been condemned by critics who say it may constitute illegal assassinations and violate international law.

Other stories focused on the debate over how to describe the drone strikes, but refrained from weighing in on one side or the other.

A September 2011 piece referred to U.S. officials who "point out that assassinations are outlawed by the U.S., which condones drone strikes against terrorists as acts of war against combatants."

In a December 2002, article about an American list of terror leaders whom the U.S. military potentially kill, the AP reporter cited American officials who noted that the list "did not abolish a long-standing presidential executive order banning assassinations, as the terrorists are defined as 'enemy combatants and

and thus legal targets."

Likewise, a December 2005 story quoted an American official stating that if the U.S. was involved in the killing of a particular al Qaida leader, "This would not be an assassination." He continued, "This is not law enforcement, this is not assassination. This is going against the leadership of an organization that has declared war on the United (Please turn to page 19)

TORONTO-BASED ARCHITECT PAUL CRAVIT has devoted much of his work to designing Jewish Cravit, Design Director at CS&P schools. (csparch.com) worked **Architects** on Community Hebrew Academy Toronto (CHAT) fifteen years ago building on a long-standing relationship with Independent schools in Canada and the firm's track record in education. The school was originally a small Toronto District School Board facility but with the help of Cravit and CS&P has expanded into two campuses: The northern Tannenbaum Campus and the south Kimmel Education facility. It was this project and his association with Jewish culture that led to the growth of the firm's work in education. CS&P recently finished a \$5 million renovation to Leo Baeck, the only reform Jewish Day School in Canada and largest in North America. There are a number of factors that must be considered when designing for a Jewish school that impact the design and set it apart from a secular facility. These can include pedagogy, culture, religion and issues of security. Classrooms are set up differently from a spatial perspective and have different requirements. Jewish festivals and holidays must be accommodated in the space and there are more stringent security requirements which need to be addressed.

The piece, entitled "Legal Questions Raised Over CIA Drone Strikes," begins by asking: "Is the CIA's secret program of drone strikes against terrorists Pakistan and Yemen a case of illegal assassinations or legitimate self defense?" Although the reporter noted that "four law professors offered conflicting views," she avoided backing any particular view.

So while the AP has recently asked whether the CIA's counter-terror drone program involves assassinations or legitimate killings, it leaves it to readers to decide. When it comes Israel's program, apparently there is no such debate. The wire service shoots first, and does not ask questions later.

Lawsuit Against Arab Bank Can Proceed

The following item was submitted by Shurat HaDin, the Israel Law Center. - the Editor

A lawsuit against a Lebanese bank accused of funneling money to the Islamist group Hezbollah through a local bank account can be heard in New York, the state's top court has ruled.

The federal suit was brought by dozens of victims of two 2006 rocket attacks in northern Israel that were allegedly perpetrated by Hezbollah. The plaintiffs claim that Beirutbased Lebanese Canadian Bank used an account with American Express in New York to wire millions of dollars to the group.

In a unanimous decision, the Court of Appeals found that because the claims arose from an alleged transaction that took place in New York, courts in the state may hear the case.

The plaintiffs' allega-"show purposeful tions availment of New York's dependable and transparent banking system, the dollar as a stable and fungible currency, and the predictable jurisdictional and commercial law of New York and the United States." Judge Susan Read wrote for the court.

The decision sent the case back to federal court, where it was initiat-

The victims of the attacks and their relatives filed suit against the Lebanese bank in 2008,

claiming it knew the transfers were being used to fund terrorist plots. They also sued American Express for

negligence.

The U.S. Court of Appeals for the 2nd Circuit in March reinstated the case against the Lebanese bank and asked the Court of Appeals to weigh in on whether New York courts had jurisdiction.

The federal court asked whether the Lebanese bank's alleged wire transactions constituted a "transaction of business" under state law, and whether the plaintiffs' claim arose from them. The Court of Appeals answered both questions in the affirmative.

The court found that New York courts have jurisdiction over the case because the alleged wires happened repeatedly, and the bank was accused of knowingly funding terrorism.

The Lebanese bank "did not (allegedly) route a transfer for a terrorist group once or twice by mistake," Read wrote. "Rather, plaintiffs allege that LCB deliberately used a New York account again and again to effect its support of (Hezbollah) and allegedly shared terrorist goals."

Chief Judge Jonathan Lippman and Judges Carmen Ciparick, Victoria Graffeo, Eugene Pigott and Robert Smith concurred.


The lawsuit was spearheaded by the Shurat HaDin Israel Law Center in Tel Aviv. In a statement the founder of the center. Nitsana Darshan-Leitner, said "every bank around the world, whether they have branches in New York or not, now knows that if they move terror money through New York they can be (hauled) into an American court and held liable by the terror victims."

Mourning for a Beloved Pet

Anyone who has had a dog or a cat knows the pain felt when the animal dies a natural death or, even worse, has to be put down to alleviate its suffering. An increasing number of Jews are searching for a Jewish roadmap for guidelines on how to mourn the loss of a pet. They are getting confusing and often contradictory advice.

Ari Enkin. an Orthodox rabbi, maintains that it is not appropriate to equate the loss of an animal with that of a person. The Jewish response to death, "Blessed is the True Judge". is reserved for the death of a human being, Enkin says. He acknowledges that some halachic authorities accept the prayer but only if the animal is a source of income as it often was in earlier times.

Reform and Conservative rabbis seem to be somewhat more sympathetic to those Jews who want to mourn their pet in a distinctly Jewish way.

Jeff Goldwaser, a Reform rabbi. understands the bonds that exist between a pet owner and his "child". He argues that while cremation is prohibited in Jewish law, it does not apply to ani-He acknowledges mals. that some Orthodox authorities would argue that the remains of a pet are a source of ritual impurity and that cremation must be avoided. Goldwaser maintains, however, that there is no absolute prohibition on cremation.

Conservative rabbi Barry Dov Lerner suggests that there are appropriate texts that a Rabbi, Cantor or even a Jewish funeral director can provide for comfort. He does say, however, that reciting kaddish and "real" prayers could be regarded as desecrating Jewish worship.
