

The Significance of Passover

Passover is, traditionally, a festival of joy. The customary salutation on the occasion refers to "a Joyous Passover", chag sameach. Time may have erased the precise details of the release of the Israelites from out of their bondage through the inhospitable desert to Promised Land. But commemorating as it does the liberation of the Jews from the slavery of Egypt, it is the Jewish Festival of Freedom, an assurance that ultimate release from bondage, however long it takes, is certain. For centuries Jews have been turning to the Passover story, celebrating this victory of the Jewish spirit over those who sought to enslave and

destroy it. Passover is a time, moreover, when despite the current turmoil, some grounds for hope and optimism seem justified.

Whatever may be the historical or philosophical bases of Passover its observance creates a radiance and a warmth which is unique even in the Jewish tradition. The recollections of Seders past are among the most heart-warming memories of those whose minds can go back even a single generation. The Passover ritual has meaning which even the most secular of Jews can grasp. Jewish life is seen at its best when viewed from the vantage point of a seat at the family Passover table.

Challenging Ilhan Omar

Dalia Al-Aquidi, a Muslim refugee from Iraq, has had enough of Ilhan Omar's identity politics. Al-Aquidi, who has over 30 years experience as a journalist, is seeking the Republican nomination in Minnesota's 5th congressional district hoping ultimately to "stop" the squad mate by "beating her at her own game".

Al-Aquidi, who is being challenged for the Republican nomination by five others, believes that in a race between her and

Omar, the latter would not be able to play on the sympathies of voters as a refugee from Somalia because they are "basically the same" in background. Al-Aquidi is particularly incensed Omar's at unabashed anti-Semitism. "Every time she opens her mouth", says Al-Aquidi, "she says something that is either anti-U.S,or antisemitic."(Omar beat out finalists neo-Nazi and white supremacist Richard Spencer and Nation of Islam leader Louis Farrakhan in a public vote for antisemite of the year).

"We've seen up close the consequences of what radical Ilhan Omar is doing. Conflict. Division. Oppression. I escaped that world once, and I won't let it happen here. I'm running for Congress because we're not as divided as Ilhan Omar and the far-left would have us believe. I'm running to bring us closer together."

The Minnesota primary will be held in August. Of interest is that Omar is not going to be the Democratic nominee without a fight. Democratic community

organizer John Mason, one of two challengers, has made it quite clear that there is no room in the Democratic party for those who espouse "anti-Semitic tropes."

Two other squad mates are also in a fight to stay in Congress. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez has opponents in both parties seeking to unseat her and Rashida Tlaib has no shortage of Republicans seeking that party's nomination. The three squad mates might yet get what they deserve.

PASSOVER SEDER IN A DP CAMP

I.F. STONE CELEBRATED PASSOVER IN 1947 IN A DETENTION CAMP ON CYPRUS

I.F. Stone, the famed investigative journalist, probably took part in some interesting Passover seders in his time, but he never spent one with Jews who felt personally connected to the events in ancient Egypt--until 1947, when he was a guest at a remarkable seder with Holocaust survivors in a detention camp on the island of Cyprus.

"This is being written 3,000 feet up over the blue Mediterranean," began Stone's dramatic account in the pages of the New York City daily newspaper PM. "I am in a tiny four-passenger two-motored mosquito plane bound for Haifa from

Nicosia in Cyprus, where I have just spent the first two days of Passover in camps established by the British to intern 'illegal' Jewish immigrants seized in Palestine."

Those were turbulent times. Hundreds of thousands of Holocaust survivors crowded the Displaced Persons camps in Allied-occupied Europe, waiting for British permission to immigrate to Palestine. The British, bowing to Arab opposition, had almost completely shut the

gates to the Holy Land. Palestine itself was in flames, as Jewish underground forces waged guerrilla warfare against the British authorities. Meanwhile, in Washington, the Truman administration wobbled back and forth on Jewish immigration and statehood.

In a desperate race for the promised land, survivors were boarding *aliya bet* (unauthorized immigration) ships bound for Palestine. More often than not, they were intercepted by British naval patrols and taken to Cyprus. That's where I.F. Stone's story began.

"There are two sets of camps on the sweet-smelling ancient Greek Isle of Cyprus for 11,300 refugees now held there," Stone explained. "Both are being enlarged to meet the expected Spring rush of Aliyah Beth boats which will probably boost the Jewish population to 20,000 before the end of June."

The detainees were living in Nissen huts, which Stone described as "the ugliest architecture known

FIDDLER ON THE ROOF RETURNS TO MONTREAL





Anybody But Trump

In a recent survey released by the Jewish Electorate Institute two thirds of Jewish voters said that they would support any Democratic candidate over Donald Trump.

The survey, taken in the wake of Bernie Sanders' refusal to attend the annual AIPAC conference, showed that even though Jewish voters react more unfavourably towards the Democratic front runner, 65% of Jews said they would still vote for him.

A majority of those polled hold "President Trump at least partially responsible for the targeted attacks on synagogues in recent years" and almost half said Trump had emboldened right wing extremists and white nationalists.

There was some good news for Trump. His disapproval rating Jews dropped from 71% last year to 61% noe. And a majority of voters, Democratic and favoured Republican, Trump's overall performance on "U.S.-Israel relations". But this was counter balanced by the fact that only a third of pro Israel voters said that candidate's а stance on Israel would be the determining factor in how voted.

to mankind--a sort of tin igloo with cement flooring set in bleak rows on the level grassless plots near the sea, surrounded with barbed wire and a row of latrines." A typical hut housed three families in three rooms.

"Unexpected and unannounced," Stone and a friend, Alex Taylor of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, dropped in on the Efrati family on Passover eve. Moshe Efrati, 35, "a laundryman by trade"; his wife Rachel; and their children, 15 year-old Miriam and 12 year-old son Eliezer. Despite the lack of an invitation, the visitors "were at once made welcome."

"Father Efrati sat at the head of the table, reclining on a pillow as is customary for the seder," Stone's account continued. "On his right, sat his brighteyed son of 12, already a student in the yeshivah organized by religious Jews in the camp." On the father's left sat his good wife and daughter. Alex and I were given hagadas and the seder went on."

"It was no hop-skipand-jump affair, as is customary in most American Jewish homes," Stone noted. "Efrati left nothing out. We rose to drink our wine with blessings, partook of the bitter herbs and first matzohs. Efrati sang the parts with relish and explained and translated as he went along..."

Stone, himself a secular Jew, was deeply moved

by the warmth and religious devotion of the family, especially in the midst of such difficult surroundings. "The mother looked on as if she didn't know how one man could be so bright," he wrote, "and the daughter was fascinated while the son's eyes shone."

What struck Stone the most was the connection between past and present. "The Passover has a

15 928 Gouin West, Ste-Geneviève Québec deep personal meaning for these Jews...For them the ancient cruel taskmasters were no fable: they had been in slave labor camps under German occupation. For them, the God who smote the Egyptians was the same God who brought the Third Reich low."

As he strolled around the camp the next day, Stone was impressed by the vibrant life he encountered among the Cyprus exiles. "Life flows on strong, and vigorous babies are being born at the rate of 30 to 40 monthly," he reported. "There have been almost 600 weddings since the camps were established last August, and there were 135 nuptials during the two weeks before Passover."

"There are schools and synagogues, camp newspapers, an art exhibition, and workshops," not to mention "several soccer teams which often play the British guards and boast they have never been beaten."

What did the future hold? The seder with the Efratis offered a clue. "Were [the DPs in Cyprus] not like the Jews under Moses?" Stone asked. "Moses went through one kind of wilderness or another to the promised land. And as Efrati explained in his own running commentary to the service comfortingly, 'We had to go down into Egypt for 400 years, but we need only be six months or so in Cyprus.' "

Stone thought Efrati's prediction too optimistic. Given the severe British restrictions on Jewish immigration, "it will take 18 months before the latest arrivals get their chance to go to Palestine."

`But British rule in Palestine did not last another 18 months. That autumn, in the face of the Jewish underground's military assaults and sharply escalating international

by sympathetic journalists such as Stone, the British surrendered. Seven months after Stone's Passover with

pressure, generated in part the Efratis, London accepted the United Nations vote on partitioning Palestine and announced it would withdraw. Four months later, the first British troops began leaving, and two months after that, on May 15, 1948, the British withdrawal was completed.

For the Efratis and the thousands of other DPs

whose plight I.F. Stone helped publicize with his impassioned prose, the agony of the exodus was over and the long awaited homecoming was finally at



food and the show. Be sure to make reservations. We started off with a signature Tao-tini (Belvedere Mango Passion. Malibu Run. Cranberry and Fresh Lime), a glass of prosecco and a Bubbles and Berries (True Premium Vodka, Chandon Brut, St. Germain and Fresh Strawberries). We then moved on to various appetizers: The Peking duck spring rolls with hoisin sauce, the spicy tuna tartare on crispy rice and the salmon sashimi followed by miso glazed Chilean sea bass, grilled 12 ounce imperial waygu ribeye (served with crispy fried onions and wow this was beyond amazing!) and lobster and kimchee fried rice.

BLACK TAP: What fun it was for me to experience Black (www.blacktap.com) restaurant for the first time and no less their new flagship 35th Street location (known as Black Tap 35th). Inspired by the old-school luncheonettes we grew up in, Black Tap is touted as the new take on the classic burger joint. Upscale, but not fussed-up, their award winning burgers have gotten a lot of well-deserved attention in a short amount of time

A BRAZILIAN DIN-ING EXPERIENCE: Fogo de Chão (fogo-dee-shown) is a leading Brazilian steakhouse, or churrascaria, specializing in the centuries-old Southern Brazilian cooking technique of churrasco the art of roasting highquality cuts of meats over open flame, all of which are carved tableside Brazilian-trained gaucho chefs. There is Picanha (signature sirloin), Mignon, Ribeye, Fraldinha (Brazilian sirloin) Cordeiro (lamb) and more. In addition to the main dishes, they boast a gourmet market table, authentic

Brazilian side dishes, and an award-winning wine list. Founded in Southern Brazil in 1979, there are currently 56 locations throughout Brazil, the United States, Mexico and the Middle East. I had a chance to experience this restaurant for the very first time at the beautiful West 53rd Street location in midtown Manhattan, just a short walk from Times Square and steps away from MoMA. I opted for the Full Churrasco Experience, which for \$69.95 includes the trained chefs coming to your table. Everything was so fresh and delicious. 

have 25 years of my reruns. What they decided to do is sell a couple of years' worth of reruns. But I'm not tired," the 77-year-old said, "so Judy Justice will be coming out a year later."

Meanwhile, Judge Sheindlin has waded into the presidential campaign, making it clear that Mike Bloomberg was the best Democrat to take on Donald Trump. "Why risk it? Why risk it on a fantasy or on somebody who is just a really nice guy?" she asked, referring Sen. Bernie Sanders former Vice and President Joe Biden. "You

want sentimental, turn on Sinatra," she said. "You want a president, you vote for Mike Bloomberg," she added. Clearly, most Democrats did not share her point of view.

Vatican Releases Documents

He's one of the most controversial Popes and the question of his role in the Holocaust has been the subject of much debate. Now the Vatican has unsealed its secret archive relating to the Holocaustera Pope Pius X11. The opening will not happen immediately. The archives will open on March 2, 2020, the 81st anniversary of the election of Pius X11 in 1939.

The Vatican has always maintained that Pius worked behind the scenes to save Jews. Critics, however, argue that Pius turned a blind eye to Jewish suffering and was actually complicit in the persecutions of the German regime.

Pius was Pope from March 1939 until Oct.1958. Prior to becoming Pope Eugenio Pacelli served as the Holy See ambassador to Germany from 1917-1929. He witnessed first hand the rise of Nazism.

Scholars have long called on the Vatican to open its secret archives on Pius. Now, after taking 14 years to do inventory, the documents will finally be available, shedding light on Pius' wartime actions. The archives may put to rest the question of whether Pius X11 record was, in the words of Bishop Sergio, a scholar of ancient manu-
