

REFLECTIONS ON PASSOVER

The spirit of Passover is the spirit of optimism. It is our assurance that whatever Jewry may have suffered, whatever Jewry may suffer in the future, it has still the power to rise above the agony of the present and work towards a future in which not Jews alone but all peoples may share the four freedoms enunciated by President Roosevelt - freedom of speech, freedom of worship, freedom from want and freedom from fear.

Passover does, indeed, mark a turning point in Jewish history. During the three hundred years in which the Israelites suffered the stinging lash of the Egyptian whip they were hammered on the anvil of oppression and suffering, into a people. This people struggled, as so many peoples have struggled over the past centuries, for self-determination, for the right to satisfy its own spiritual and religious aspirations. Finally, under the guidance

of Moses, probably the greatest personality the world has ever known, our ancient ancestors emerged out of their Egyptian ghetto and began their first faltering steps towards the fulfillment of what has turned out be a historic purpose.

But Passover has a meaning which goes beyond the historic and philosophical. Its observance creates a radiance and warmth which is unique in the Jewish tradi-Our recollections of Seders past are among the most tender and most heart-warming memories many of us have. The Passover ritual has meaning which even the most rationalistic secularists are able to grasp. It has a beauty which no other aspect of Jewish life, even a synagogue service, can begin to match. Jewish life is, indeed, seen at its finest and most beautiful from the vantage point of a seat at the Passover table and in the stirrings of memories, ancient and new.

A Concession For Passover

Hunter College High School is a prestigious middle and high school in Manhattan. It is a coveted destination for many New York City students, including Jews.

But is also incredibly difficult to get into. Indeed, getting to even write its three-hour entrance exam is by invitation only and open only to students whose scores on state exams in English and math exceed a high threshold. Nor can a student get into the school after the seventh grade.

This year's entrance exam was scheduled for April 5th, the morning of the first Pesach Seder. Erica Rahavy's son was invited to take the test but was dismayed that the school did not seem to understand that Jews "travel to be with their families on the holidays." "I have no problem missing the day of school for my kids", she said. "We've done that before to celebrate holidays with our families. It shouldn't be so high-stakes that it's just one day or nothing."

Rahavy sent an email to the school asking if administrators would offer "alternate time for students celebrating the holiday."


Hunter College responded tersely: "The Entrance Exam will only be held on Wednesday April 5, 2023 in the morning and students will have about three hours to complete the exam. HCCS is unable to administer make-up exams."


But the school, knowing that New York city schools are obliged to show sensitivity to religious observance, had a change of heart. Its website announced that "an alternate test date for religious observance on Tuesday after-

noon, April 4, 2023, held at Hunter College, will be made available on request."

Rahavy believes that accommodating a widely observed Jewish holiday in New York, where Jews make up more than 10% of the population, was the only

option Hunter had. "I can't imagine they would have planned this out on Christmas Eve when families travel to be with each other for the holidays," she said.

Yulia's husband is a solder in the Ukrainian army and is in hospital recovering from wounds suffered during the fighting.



WHY OHIO TOWN IS NAMED EAST PALESTINE

WHY MANY AMERICAN TOWNS HAVE BIBLICAL NAMES

A toxic spill has drawn the nation's attention to the little town of East Palestine, Ohio, just as another tragedy, the explosion of the space shuttle Columbia in 2003, turned the nation's gaze upon the town of Palestine, Texas, where much of the debris landed.

The tragic spotlight now shining on Ohio's "East Palestine" naturally leaves some people curious as to why it has such as unusual name. The answer is that it's not a very unusual name Dr. Rafael Medoff is the author of more than 20 books about Jewish history and Zionism, including The Historical Dictionary of Zionism with Chaim I. at all.

Elsewhere in Ohio, there are towns named Hebron, Gilboa, Canaan, and Shiloh (two of them, in fact). There's even a Sodom, which was given its name after a prohibition advocate, disappointed at the small turnout for his lecture in 1840, jokingly compared the locale to that infamous

biblical center of sin.

In Texas, in addition to Palestine, there are towns named Hebbronville and Joshua. There is a Hebron in North Dakota and a Sinai in South Dakota, a Jerusalem in Arkansas, a Jericho in Vermont, a Bethlehem as well as a Nazareth in Pennsylvania, and a Zion in Maryland. Nearly every state

has one or more towns named after biblical sites or individuals. Altogether, there are more than 1,000 biblically-named towns from coast to coast.

Towns such as East Palestine, Ohio, were established by 19th-century religious Christian settlers; they chose those names to express their spiritual attachment to the land and people of the Bible. When they thought of Palestine, they recalled the Jewish kingdoms and temples of




Alden Ehrenreich, who stars in the movie "Cocain Bear", made a home

HELPFUL HINTS FOR THE JEWISH TRAVELLER

FORT LAUDER-DALE: Last winter I was thrilled to make my escape for a winter getaway in the sunny state of Florida. For the first time, I had the opportunity to visit Fort Lauderdale, which was a real treat (https://www.visit lauderdale.com).

Fort Lauderdale is the largest municipality in Broward County, which encompasses 1,197 square miles with 24 miles of Atlantic Ocean beach. It has a resident population of over 1.95 million people.

Fort Lauderdale is the home to about 24000 Jews out of a population of 180,000, There are around 10 synagogues in the Fort Lauderdale area covering many different streams of Judaism. Of the 16 synagogues listed in the Fort Lauderdale Yellow Pages, four are in Plantation, four are listed n Sunrise, three in

Lauderdale, two in Miami Beach and one in Miami.

WHERE TO STAY: During my trip, I chose to stay at the B Ocean Resort (https://www.boceanresort.com/), which many people may remember as the former Sheraton Yankee Clipper.

Jewish CEO and founder of B Hotels & Resorts is Ayelet Weinstein, who started working in multi-family and condoconversions in 1996. In 2004, she became interested in a local building that she assumed to be an apartment building. After pursuing the building and learning it was, in fact, a hotel, she discovered a passion for the hospitality industry and has remained involved ever since.

The resort is conveniently located in the heart of the city, around 15 minutes from Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport, Port Everglades, downtown Las Olas Boulevard and along the famed coastal highway A1A. 





The two Jewish musicians are submitting a proposal to the Recording Academy to add "best Jewish music album" to the lists of awards...The late Richard Belzer may not have "worked Jewish". But his routines often included bits and pieces of Jewish material. Moreover, the role for which he was best known, Det. John Munch on "Homicide: Life on the Street" and "Law and Order: Special Victims Unit", identified as Jewish. Yet no mention was made in various obituaries that

Belzer was Jewish.

Mayim Bialik owes her hosting gig on 'Jeopardy' to her son. Fifteenyear-old son Miles told her that he saw a post on social media that 'Jeopardy' was looking for guest hosts. A JEWISH WEDDING IN THE UNITED ARAB EMIRATES



THE FIRST JEWISH WEDDING WAS HELD REcently in the newly inaugurated Abrahamic Family House in the UAE. Avi Berkowitz, a former assistant to U.S President Donald Trump, was married at the Moses Ben Maimon Synagogue, one of three houses of worship in the interfaith complex which opened in 2022. The Abrahamic Family House, with its synagogue, church and mosque, is the first of its kind in the Middle East and was designed by British architect Sir David Adjaye. "Essentially, the inspiration was to understand that the three religions really emanate from this extraordinary region," Adjaye said. The synagogue has a main sanctuary, two mikvot, beit midrash and a residence for a young rabbinical couple who will live on site.



ancient times, as well as the events surrounding the origins of Christianity in the Jewish town of Bethlehem. In their prayers, they prayed for the return of the Jews to the Holy Land, which they understood to be inextricably linked to the coming messianic age.

The area that became East Palestine was originally known as Mechanicsburg. There are a number of towns in the U.S. that were originally settled by mechanics of various types. But in the case of Ohio, "Mechanicsburg" was changed in 1836 because according to an early history of the region—"the wife of Dr. Robert Chamberlin desired a more euphonious appellation and desired it [be] called 'Palestine,' the quiet beauty of the little town, and the earnest, virtuous, simple life of its people suggesting to her a name recalling holy memories."

Since there already

was a town named "Palestine" in the western part of the state—likewise founded by religious Christians who wanted to infuse their town with "holy memories"—government officials, in assigning the new post office, added the prefix "East."

That early account of East Palestine's founding was published in 1905, when it was common for a married woman's name to be hidden behind that of her husband. But a historical marker in front of the log house where the Chamberlins once lived tells us that the name of the doctor's wife was Rebecca—an appropriately biblical name for a woman who took her Bible seriously.

Not surprisingly, numerous churches quickly sprung up in East Palestine and its environs. Lutheran and Reformed congregations established the Salem Church, choosing a name

derived from "Jerusalem." Evangelical Lutherans founded the St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church, while Methodists originally held their services in a local school—the separation between church and state was still rather fuzzy in those days—before eventually erecting their Methodist Episcopal Church. East Palestine also had a United Presbyterian Church and, later, another house of worship with a biblically-inspired name, the Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church.

When America's religious Christian settlers thought of the Holy Land, they thought of the Hebrew bible and the area's 3,000 years of Jewish inhabitation, not the Koran or the more recently-arrived Arab residents of the area. They thought of the many Jews who appear in the accounts of the birth of Christianity

(including its founder), texts that do not mention any Palestinian Arabs.

Certainly Americans were aware that there were Arabs living in Palestine in the 19th century. Mark Twain, for example, had mentioned them in his account of his visit to the Holy Land, The Innocents Abroad (1869). So had Herman Melville in his famous Clarel: A Poem and the Pilgrimage in the Holy Land (1876).

But it was common knowledge that the Arab population of Palestine was relatively small and unsettled, and that the Arab res-19th-century idents of Palestine regarded themselves as part of southern Syria, not as a separate nationality. H. Allen Tupper, Jr. wrote in the New York Times in 1896, after having "ridden on horseback more than four hundred miles through Palestine Syria," that virtually the only local people he en-

countered were "merchantmen with their long camel trains" and "wild Bedouin tribes" that "reside in one locality not more than two months."

Today's residents pronounce East Palestine "Palesteen," but the original

settlers undoubtedly pronounced it the more common way because it was the Holy Land, with its deep Jewish roots, that burned bright in the hearts and prayers of the founders of many of the biblicallynamed towns across America. And it is for the same reason that Bible-believing Christians today—probably including more than a few residents of East Palestine, Ohio—constitute one of the major sources of pro-Israel sentiment in the United States.



dent Oren Eisner, concluded that textbooks in Moroccan schools embrace Jewish life and that Jews are entwined in the national and cultural fabric of Morocco. The study examined 127 textbooks in state-run schools emphasizing social studies. history, Islamic studies, language and literature.

"We want to thank the Kingdom of Morocco for taking steps to improve its curriculum and spread tolerance and understanding throughout the Middle East" said Eisner. The report noted that reforms were meant to familiarize students with Jews and Judaism "to a far greater extent than other curricula we have reviewed.". Students now know that the Jewish community is an "inseparable part" of Morocco, it continued.

Added IMPACT-se CEO Marcus Sheff: "We are struck by this unique embrace of Jews and Judaism in the reformed Moroccan school curriculum. The affection through which Morocco's Jewish community and its customs are represented as well as the lives of individual Moroccan Jews is heart-warming."

The report did suggest one area of the curriculum still needs attention. The Holocaust is not taught in schools and while a two state solution to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict endorsed, there is a clear bias for the Palestinian side.

Morocco is home to some 2000 Jews.





in 2019 has coincided with two last place finishes and the departure of several high profile players to free agency. The successful playoff run in 2021 has long been forgotten by fans used to repeated winning seasons.

And so Red Sox fans need a scapegoat and Bloom has become that target. He told the Boston Globe that he has received death threats and anti-semitic slurs as the team has struggled. Last year, the team released a minor league player after a series of social media attacks against Bloom, including calling him "an embarrassment to any torah-following jew."

Bloom maintains that he understands the frustration of the fans, especially with the Boston Bruins and Boston Celtics dominating hockey and basketball. He acknowledged that he is "suffering when we lose" just as much as his critics.

Bloom is a Jewish day school graduate, observes shabbat and keeps a kosher home. During his 15 years with the Tampa Bay Rays prior to joining the Red Sox Bloom and his family lived close to Tropicana Field so he could walk to home games on Friday nights.

Saying "No" To Roger Waters

Roger Waters, the bassist for Pink Floyd, is a persistent critic of Israel. He is at the forefront of the BDS movement and is constantly spreading anti-Semites tropes.

Waters was scheduled to perform on May 28th

hall and recently nounced that it was cancelling the planned concert. "The background to the cancelation is the persistent anti-Israel behaviour of the former Pink Floyd frontman, who is considered one of the most widely spread antisemites of the world," the city said in a statement. "He repeatedly called for a cultural boycott of Israel and drew comparisons to the apartheid regime of South Africa and put pressure on artists to cancel events in Israel."

Predictably, Waters reacted to the cancellation by retweeting messages of support from an author and editor at the Palestine Chronicle who denied that the singer is an antisemite and an editor at the Delhi, India-based Marxist pub-Leftword lishing house Books. who defended Waters' stance on Israel. "Love you my brother," Waters tweeted at Vijay Prashad, adding, "shoulder to shoulder. F–k em'!"

Waters has now launched a lawsuit against the cities of Munich and Frankfurt for cancelling his shows. At press time Munich has relented..



ing as a candidate in the next election. It's just one more attempt on the part of Starmer to break with Labor's anti-Semitic past.

Corbyn says he will still seek the party nomination in a riding he has served since 1983 and where he still has considerable support. "Any attempt block to mv candidacy is a denial of due process, and should be opposed by anybody who believes in the value of democracy," he said. Rumours have it that he will run as an Independent if he fails to secure the nomination in Islington North.

British voters general seem to support Starmer's decision. A poll by Savanta for the Politics Home website showed that 55 per cent of voters supported Starmer while only 23 per cent opposed it. Twenty-two percent of the 2144 people polled said they did not know what to make of the decision. Twenty-eight precent said the move would affect their vote in the next election, with 12 percent saying it would make them less likely to vote Labour and 16 percent saying it would make them more likely.

Starmer is not apologizing for his decision.

Palestinian Artwork Removed

Artwork at the entrance to the children's outpatient's department at the Chelsea and Westminster hospital in London, designed by children at two United Nations schools in Gaza, has been removed after Jewish patients complained that it was making them feel uncomfortable. The artwork included plates showing the Dome of the Rock with a Palestinian flag and artwork suggesting the Palestinian shoreline stretches for 224 km from Rafah in the south to Ra'as al-Nagoura in the North, contrary to the borders of Israel since 1948.

Kingdom United Lawyers For Israel told hospital officials that the display made Jewish patients feel "vulnerable, harassed and victimized." "We asked that the artwork to be removed", said Jonathan Turner, the chief executive of UKLFI," because of the propaganda, not because it was by children from Gaza." Added Turner: "We are pleased that it was taken down; Jewish patients should not have to face a wall of anti-Israel propa-



ganda when they to hospital."

Leslie Watts, the chief executive of the Chelsea and Westminster hospital admitted that the artwork, part of a collaboration between children and Gaza and the hospital's own school had "offended some communities".

Banning Ethnic Intimidation Flyers

Florida Rep Randy Fine has had enough of the recent rise in neo-Nazi nonsense in the Sunshine State. Bill H.B. 269 takes aim at Florida's anti-Semites. It would ban displays of "religious or ethnic animus" on private property, prevent the distribution of flyers with hate speech and outlaw the broadcasting of intimidating messages in public places.

Many of the anti-semitic activities at stadiums in Jacksonville, at Florida universities, at Walt Disney World and at a Chabad house in Orlando. have been led by the Goyim Defense League for whom "Ye Is Right", Its founder Jon Minadeo relocated to Florida from Northern California because he expected Florida to be more hospitable to him and his views on Jews than he found in the Bay Area.

Says Fine: "We have Nazis who have proudly taken up residence in Florida. The things they are doing, all of which I find dis-

gusting, are reprehensible, and we are going to make them felonies."

Fine knows that holding Nazi views is not illegal and that his bill will be challenged. Indeed, an online petition against H.B. 269 has already attracted more than 2500 signatures decrying "The Jewish as-

sault on freedom of speech". Another critic wrote that "No group, no matter how small their hats are, has the right to tell us what we can or can't say", the small hat an apparent reference to kippahs.

But the Florida Rep maintains that the bill simply builds on existing criminal codes. "It is illegal to trespass. It is illegal to litter. It is illegal to assault people", he said. "And we need to say that, when your stupid Nazism moves from words to action, we're going to hold you accountable."

Labour Councillor Deselected

A Labour councillor who demanded Jewish rabbinical leaders in Leicester sign statements condemning Israel has been dropped by the party's national executive committee ahead of elect-

ions in May. Kirk Master, a former assistant mayor and deputy police and crime commissioner, is one of 19 sitting councillors dropped by Labour. In May 2021, *Jewish News* revealed how Master had issued a statement calling for Jewish faith leaders to sign a declaration to "condemn the killings of the innocent

Palestinian people" and to label Israel an apartheid state.

Labour leaders were concerned that Master's comments would alienate "certain communities within our city." Leicester has only about 200 Jews but Labour is continuing to try to shed its anti-Semitic past.



Richard Ferrer responded without apology. "The Jewish News reports Jewish news. Did we like reporting on what happened in Huwara? Of course not. Do we want to run endless reports and columns about crackpots being prime movers in the Knesset? Of course not....We would rather focus on all the good things Israel does. But is this kind of thing news? Of course. It always has been and always will be. An IDF commander calling the attack on Huwara a "pogrom" should be front page news in every Jewish newspaper. There is no sugar coating or rose tinting. There is just news. Book burners stick silly posters on newspaper bins. We report news."

This is not the first time the *Jewish News* has faced a backlash from some Jews. A similar crusade against the newspaper took place at the start of COVID when the paper exposed widespread breaches of pan-

demic lockdown rules by Stamford Hill Jews.

Remains of Mikveh Found in Auschwitz

A mikvah dating back to the 17th or 18th century was discovered in the city of Oświęcim in southern Poland, The city is better known for its German name, Auschwitz. The mikveh was found several meters below a brick bathhouse.

Archaeologists said that when they initially dug up a few stairs leading down to a wooden floor, it seemed that it could be a fragment of a wooden hut. However, after removing layers of earth, it turned out to be a wooden mikveh.

At the turn of the 20th century Jews constituted more than half of the local population of Oświęcim. Very few, however, survived the Holocaust and the last Jewish

resident, Shimon Kluger, died in 2000.

Jews Still Popular In the United States

Despite a record number of antisemitic incidents in the United States, public opinion appears to be moving in the opposite direction. According to a study released by the Pew Research Center Jews are the most favourably viewed ethnic group in the country.

The poll of 10,588 Americans found that 35% expressed very or somewhat favourable attitudes towards Jews while only 6% held negative opinions. Jews were regarded more favourably than Protestant Christians, Catholic Christians, atheists, Mormons and Muslims. The latter were the second most unfavourable ethnic group(behind only the Mormons) with only 22% of Americans holding favourable views towards them.

A Great Way to Deal With An Anti-Semite

Rafael Aronov is a police officer in Be'er Sheva. But he is also a mixed martial arts fighter who was scheduled to fight Ilyas Sadykov of Kazakhstan in a MNA Israel World Combat Championship.

While "trash talk" is part of the MNA schtick, Sadykov crossed the line. He sent threatening antisemitic messages to his Israeli opponent. First there was a message with a photo of Hitler which read "I will burn you like this guy." Another one read "I'm gonna kill you b***h and "do you like German music".

Aronov, who has family members that survived the Holocaust, did not respond to Sadykov's "crossing the line." He "preferred to express his displeasure in the arena". And that is what he did. He knocked out the antisemite in five minutes.
